Last month's meeting included the important task of electing the next year's officers who will take over when we reconvene in September.



Looking Out for Our Elders

We have a wonderful mix of young and old in this neighborhood. Sometimes an older neighbor might be in need of help. Here are some signs to look for:

- Home or yard not being cared for
- Mail or newspapers piling up
- Loss of weight
- Ungroomed and/or wears the same clothes
- Appears confused
- Old food or lack of food in the refrigerator
- Pet not being cared for
- Isolation

Here are some things you can do to help:

- Introduce yourself and maybe offer your phone number if they need something
- Offer to pick up some groceries
- Just visit and talk from time to time

- Just do whatever you can, sometimes small gestures can help in many ways



If you feel your neighbor is in dire need of help, call the Elder Abuse Hotline at Adult Protective Services. They can take an anonymous report of neglect and will follow up with the neighbor to investigate if assistance is needed. The phone number for the Elder Abuse Hotline is (877) 477-3646
