
Every Sunday 9:00 AM to 2:00 PM—Grand View and Venice Blvd.

The warmer weather this spring has already resulted in a wealth of summer fruits: cherries, apricots, apriums, peaches, nectarines, plums and pluots. Samples are readily available to help you select your favorites. Be sure to bring an extra bag to the market as you will probably buy more fruit than expected.



Both regular and Thai basil are plentiful and look wonderful. Ong choy (aka morning glory leaves or Chinese water cress) is available as well as bitter melon leaves. Yam leaves and sweet potato leaves should be at the market later this month. There are also fava beans and English snap peas. Green and yellow zucchini, spherical summer squash, heirloom tomatoes and sweet white corn have made their first welcomed appearances.

New to the MVFM is Brett and Tanya Farm specializing in mushrooms, seedlings and fresh local vegetables from their Hacienda Heights location. If you want to try your hand at growing oyster mushrooms, they have created mushroom bags with the growing medium they use at their farm. With the proper care you can harvest your own oyster mushrooms in 4 to 6 weeks. Brett and Tanya's farming efforts were recently featured in the *LA Times*. Also written about in the *Times* was County Line Farm, now selling at the MVFM. Selling 100% organic produce, look for their honey yellow melons, a bit sweeter than honeydew melon and only available through mid-July.
